Our Conservation Commitments

Rescuing
We save as many sick, injured or orphaned sea creatures as we can, rehabilitating and returning them to the sea each year - and we're committed to doing more.

Protecting
We raise funds for conservation projects like Saving Nemo's Home - identifying the impacts of sea temperature rises on sedentary species such as anemones.

Breeding
Our programme protects endangered creatures like seahorses. We never take any from the sea for display and if they become extinct, we'll release our stocks into the wild.

Understanding
With over a million visitors a year, we raise the awareness of marine conservation issues, build support for conservation projects, and inspire more people around the world to care.

Campaigning
We actively engage our visitors on current marine issues, petitioning governments, hosting conferences, supporting causes such as those to ban whaling, outlaw shark-finning, support marine parks and reduce by-catch.

Expert care
We have some amazing creatures living with us. We only keep those we know will flourish in our carefully prepared habitats.

Whales and Dolphins
We believe these creatures should not be captured, kept in captivity or publicly displayed and are actively committed to ethical methods of reducing the numbers that are.

Our latest campaigns

Get involved with our latest campaign to raise funds to fit rescued turtles with satellite tags so we can learn more about these endangered animals and how we can better protect them.

In partnership with NSW DPI and State Water Corporation, SEA LIFE Marine Conservation Trust Australia is raising funds to restore habitat for our endangered freshwater fish. The 1,000km habitat challenge is an initiative to bring attention to the plight many of our freshwater fish face.

SEA LIFE Marine Conservation Trust Australia is also collaborating with Manly SEA LIFE Sanctuary and National Parks and Wildlife Service to monitor Manly's critically endangered Little Penguins and to raise awareness of how we can help conserve this last mainland population.
